

CCISC Training and Implementation

Comprehensive, Continuous, Integrated System of Care (CCISC) is the product of Ken Minkoff MD and Chris Cline MD, but what does it mean at the local, practical, street level, real world of community mental health and substance abuse agencies? This one day seminar is prepared to help you answer this question and prepare you to examine your system for its implementation.

It is one thing to attend the workshops done by Drs. Minkoff and Cline and understand their work at the systems level and another to create and motivate middle management and front line workers to actually implement their visions and assistance to your system. This seminar is designed for the people who are “in the trenches” and need to better understand the basic principles and “relearning” that is necessary to create a truly comprehensive, continuous, integrated system of care in your community.

This course is not to take the place of trainings done by Minkoff and Cline, but rather to augment their work.

Course Objectives:

Participants who complete this course will be able:

1. to demonstrate a working knowledge of the purpose and scope CCISC principles
2. to determine what barriers exist that make integration a challenge
3. to determine alternatives that move a system towards integration
4. to establish a road map for next steps at the home community
